Gateshead Local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB) is concerned that the licensable activities taking place at Whitehall Convenience Store/Devi General Dealer, 143 Whitehall Road are not in accordance with the promotion of another licensing objective, which is the protection of children from harm.

It has come to the attention of Gateshead LSCB that there is evidence to suggest that underage sales of alcohol have taken place at Whitehall Convenience Store/Devi General Dealer, thereby demonstrating a failure to promote the licensing objective to protect children from harm. On 1 June 2017 alcohol was sold to a 15 year old child volunteer, contrary to section 146(1) of the Licensing Act 2003. The 15 year old was able to purchase four cans of Stella lager from the store.

## Please provide as much information as possible to support the representation

Gateshead Local Safeguarding Children Board, the body responsible for the protection of children from harm, is concerned that the licensable activities are not in accordance with the promotion of the licensing objectives, one of which is the protection of children from harm. The protection of children and young people has always been a core commitment of all partners who work together in Gateshead to keep them safe.

The LSCB has received information that there were concerns in April 2017 that alcohol was being sold to 13 year olds. On 1 June 2017 a test purchase operation was carried out by officers from Gateshead Trading Standards using a child volunteer and they were able to purchase four cans of Stella Lager. The lager was sold by Amrita Kaur, who was working in the store that day. She did not ask the volunteer to produce ID to prove his age.

The premises licence holder is Hany Adil and the owner and Designated Premises Supervisor is Manjit Kaur. Manjit Kaur was subsequently interviewed under caution and stated that she sold the business on 3 June 2017 and confirmed that she had owned the business for 3½ years prior to the sale. Prior to the underage sale being made, a Trading Standards Officer visited the store on 14 March and issued Manjit Kaur with an advice pack. This contained a refusals book and a proxy sales poster. Manjit Kaur said under caution that she had a vague recollection of receiving the pack but did not give this to Amrita Kaur to read. She stated that she'd previously had a conversation with Amrita about asking for ID but admitted that she could have done more to prevent the sale. She also stated that she is generally struggling and that is why she sold the business. She explained that Amrita Kaur had made a mistake.

LSCBs are the key statutory mechanism for protecting children from harm and agreeing how the relevant organisations in each local area will cooperate to safeguard and promote the welfare of children, and for ensuring the effectiveness of what they do. Gateshead LSCB is made up of a number of statutory partners including Gateshead Council, Gateshead Health NHS Foundation Trust, Newcastle Gateshead CCG, North East Ambulance Service, Northumberland, Tyne and Wear NHS Foundation Trust, Northumbria CRC, Northumbria Police, Tyne & Wear Fire and Rescue Service and CAFCASS. Access to alcohol by young people and the resulting crime and disorder is a significant community problem that impacts on crime, and the fear of crime, within many areas of the Borough as well as being an issue that puts children and young people at risk themselves. The vision of Gateshead LSCB is that every child should grow up in a loving and secure environment, which is free from abuse, neglect and crime, enabling them to enjoy good health and fulfil their social and educational potential. Evidence suggests that binge drinking in adolescence could limit opportunities for this to occur and therefore the LSCB is keen to ensure that licensees restrict access to alcohol by underage drinkers and have processes in place to ensure the protection of children from harm.

Research suggests that the adolescent brain may be uniquely sensitive to alcohol's effects due to the major changes in brain structure and function that occur during this developmental period. Studies have found that binge drinking by youths is also associated with alcohol-related violence and other anti-social behaviours. A UK study found that binge drinking in adolescence was associated with an increased risk of health, social,

educational and economic adversity continuing into later adult life. Alcohol intoxication can occur during binge drinking and the acute toxic effects are generally related to blood alcohol concentrations. There is evidence to suggest that the severe hypoglycaemia (low blood sugar) that can accompany alcohol intoxication and may result in coma occurs more commonly in adolescents than adults. Deaths from alcohol poisoning appear to occur most often when relatively inexperienced drinkers consume very large amounts of alcohol in a short time

The information above would appear to suggest that Whitehall Convenience Store/Devi General Dealer, 143 Whitehall Road is not complying with the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm. Licence objectives and laws are not being followed and children in Gateshead are at risk because of this.

### Please state the ground(s) for representation (please read guidance note 1)

This representation is made in my capacity as Director of Public Health for the Borough of Gateshead. The Director of Public Health in Gateshead is concerned that the licensable activities taking place at Devi General Dealer in Gateshead are not in accordance with the promotion of the licensing objectives, one of which is 'The protection of children from harm.'

It has come to the attention of the Public Health Team that there is evidence to confirm that underage sales of alcohol have taken place at Devi General Dealer, thereby demonstrating a failure to promote the licensing objective to protect children from harm. On 1<sup>st</sup> June 2017, Gateshead Council Trading Standards carried out a test purchase operation using a 15 year old child volunteer who was sold a 4 pack of Stella lager by Amrita Kaur. Miss Amrita Kaur did not ask the volunteer to provide ID to prove her age.

Since 2013 Directors of Public Health have been 'responsible authorities' under the Licensing Act 2003. The role of the Director of Public Health is to help promote the health and wellbeing of the local populations they serve. The Public Health approach to alcohol is to encourage and promote responsible drinking and protect young people from related harm. This is an expansive remit that influences a wide range of circumstances, including local licensing arrangements. Similarly the licensing regime is concerned with the promotion of the licensing objectives, which collectively seek to protect the quality of life for those who live, and work in the vicinity of licensed premises, and those who socialise in licensed premises.

This representation is made in respect of the review of the premises licence for Devi General Dealer. I am particularly concerned that the arrangements to prevent underage sales are not sufficiently robust and therefore fail to protect children from harm. The sale to a minor demonstrates that the checks and balances in place are not rigorous enough and could also lead to a significantly heightened risk of proxy sales, due to the lack of care being taken to check the authenticity and age of the person buying the alcohol.

The sale of alcohol to children leads to a negative impact on the children that consume the alcohol and on those who live and work in the vicinity of the premises. Alcohol can have a significant impact on the health of young people and alcohol related harm remains one of the biggest health problems. Research suggests that alcohol can affect the developing brain in early adolescence, and this is also the age when some young people are particularly vulnerable to risk taking. The Healthy Child Programme (2010) states that 50% of adolescent binge drinkers are more likely to be dependent on alcohol or misusing substances when they reach the age of 30. Alcohol misuse in adolescence has been linked to poorer memory, increased risk of addiction in later life, impaired ability to understand the physical world. The Chief Medical Officer issues

## Please state the ground(s) for representation (please read guidance note 1)

An underage sale occurred on the premises during a test purchase operation on 1 June 2017.

The Premises Licence Holder claimed he knew nothing about the Licence as he said it had been transferred to Manjit Kaur. However, Mr Adil claims that he believed the Licence was transferred to Ms Kaur. However, the invoices in 2015 and 2016 were sent to Mr Adil, at what we believe is his home address and were subsequently paid. This casts doubt on Mr Adil's claim and raises concerns over the management of the premises.

Monitoring compliance with the promotion of the licensing objectives in relation to this premises is difficult due to their being very few conditions attached to the Licence. For example the premises is not currently obliged to operate a challenge either 21 or 25 policy, they are not obliged to keep training records, they are not obliged to keep a refusals register nor to have CCTV.

The lack of conditions causes difficulties on the occasions that the premises are inspected as there is little to inspect. On similar Licences with more up to date conditions Officers can confirm what training has been undertaken, how often people are refused service due to for example age and review incidents by requesting CCTV footage.

The current licence has been in place since 3 August 2005.	
The only conditions on the Licence are the Mandatory ones, relating to the supply of alcohol these being the	
requirement for a DPS, the requirement for a personal licence holder, the requirement for age verification	

and the prohibition on sale of alcohol below duty plus VAT.

On 26 September 2013 Hany Adil submitted an application to transfer the premises licence into his name and nominated himself as the designated premises supervisor. Northumbria Police had no objections to these applications.

Hany Adil subsequently nominated Manjit Kaur as the designated premises supervisor in an application on 1 December 2014. Northumbria Police had no objection to this application.

The finance records show that each year from 2014 on the anniversary of the licence being granted (August) an invoice is raised and sent out to Mr Adil at 2 Ladyrigg, Ponteland, Northumberland, NE20 9QS (believed to be Mr Adil's home address). The 2014, 2015 and 2016 invoices have all been paid.

Of note here is that the invoices are sent to an address that Mr Adil provided to the Licensing Section on his application. They are not sent out to the premises.

This raises the question that if he thought that Manjit Kaur was also the premises licence holder why did Mr Adil pay the 2015 and 2016 invoices. These invoices can be provided if needed.

Following the review application being submitted (the following day) applications to transfer the licence and to vary the DPS were made, however even if these are granted whilst the management of the premises may change it will not address the concerns regarding the lack of meaningful and measurable controls being

attached to the Licence in the form of conditions.
