In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;
 - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:
 - (a) A holographic mark, or
 - (b) An ultraviolet feature.

Prohibition on sale of alcohol below cost of duty plus VAT

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a. 'Duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - b. 'Permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula -

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where -

4.

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol.
- c. 'Relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. The holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e. 'Value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by paragraph b of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 - a. Sub-paragraph b below applies where the permitted price given by paragraph b of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - b. The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- A CCTV system will be in operation at the premises and recorded images shall be retained for a period of 28 days. The data will be made available to the Police and authorised officers of the Council upon reasonable request, in line with the Data Protection Act.
- Cameras will be located internally and externally, and the camera capturing the customer at the counter will be of a quality so as to provide facial recognition.
- The data controller will train key members of staff in the use of the CCTV system.
- A refusals and incidents register will be maintained at the premises (bound or electronic). The register will be made available for inspection by the Police and authorised officers of the Council upon reasonable request.
- 5. All spirits will be behind the counter.
- Between the hours of 23:00 and 05:00, the premises will close to the public and all sales will take place via the serving hatch.
- 7. Panic buttons will be in use.
- 8. All staff at the store will be trained in how to manage any persons who may create a public nuisance in the vicinity of the store. Such people will be asked to leave the area quietly (if it is safe to do so) and an entry will be made in the incident register.
- 9. A notice will be on display asking customers to respect the neighbours when leaving the premises.
- 10. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy. Whenever a person looks or appears to be under the age of 25, they will be challenged for ID to prove that they are 18 years or older.
- 11. Posters will be on display advising customers of the Challenge 25 policy.
- 12. The only types of ID that will be accepted as proof of age will be passports, driving licences and PASS cards.
- 13. Staff will be trained before making sale of alcohol in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. This includes the prevention of underage sales, the Challenge 25 policy, proxy sales, acceptable ID and intoxicated customers. Training will be documented and made available to the Police and authorised officers of the Council upon reasonable request.
- 14. Refresher staff training will take place at least every 6 months.
- 15. A system of till prompts will be in place, that will appear when age restricted products are scanned, reminding the staff member that a Challenge 25 policy is in place.
- 16. Whenever the DPS is not on the premises, a Duty Manager will be appointed in respect of the premises. The Duty Manager will hold the Level 2 Award for Personal Licence Holders qualification.
