**TITLE OF REPORT: Mainstream Schools Funding** 

## Purpose of the Report

To bring to Schools Forum the proposed Authority Proforma Tool (APT) for submission of Gateshead Schools funding factors and values to the DfE for approval, to enable the calculation of mainstream schools individual school budgets for 2018/19.

# **Background**

This report builds on reports to Schools Forum in November and December 2017 and item 5 of the 11 January 2018 forum agenda (the previous report).

Gateshead received its Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) funding settlement on 19 December 2017. Since receipt of the settlement, work has been undertaken to calculate individual mainstream school budgets.

The Schools and Early Years Finance Regulations for 2018 have not yet been issued, therefore as such the mainstream schools allocations have been calculated under the Schools and Early Years Finance Regulations 2017, which came into force 16 February 2017, and the Schools Revenue Funding 2018/19 – Operational Guidance, updated in December 2017.

The schools block allocation of funding for 2018/19 is £108.909m which is calculated:

- Primary pupil numbers \* Primary Unit of Funding (PUF) 15,000 x £4,036.39 = £60.546m
- Secondary pupil numbers \* Secondary Unit of Funding (SUF) 8,742 x £5,023.26
  = £43.913m
- Plus £4.450m for growth funding, premises and mobility factors

Therefore, the amount available to fund Gateshead mainstream schools in 2018/19 is £108.909m, an increase of £3.581m from 2017/18.

This amount of funding has been used to calculate Gateshead mainstream schools individual schools budgets using the APT based on the formula factors proposed.

A number of inputs and adjustments were made to the APT prior to modelling. These included:-

 Input of estimated rates charges for 2018/19 and adjustments for actual rates charges for 2017/18 in comparison to the amount funded for 2017/18. There have been some swings in rates charges due to revaluations of school premises and the proposed change in the business rates multiplier. New school buildings also opened during 2016 and 2017.

- For 2018/19, all schools including voluntary aided and voluntary controlled schools will pay rates, as the rate relief has been reduced from 100% to 80% for these schools. Therefore an estimate of these charges has been included in the APT.
- The DfE issued the updated rates data for academies; however they have not yet provided any data for Riverside Primary Academy. A query has been raised with the DfE, but at the time of writing no answer had been received. Therefore the rates funding for Riverside Primary Academy will be funded at the 2017/18 level.
- The PFI factor was re-calculated to take into account the changes in pupil numbers and updated PFI charges for 2018/19.
- De-delegation has been input as agreed at December's Schools Forum, and if required, will be further updated with any additional decisions from January's Schools Forum.

The APT was received 15 December and contains an updated data set for the calculation of the mainstream school budgets, predominately based on the October 2017 census. The updated data set was checked against last year's APT data to review the changes in data. There were found to be no unexpected changes in data.

The Key Stage 2 (KS2) Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) are used to as a prior attainment measure for the secondary phase. These tests became more challenging from summer 2016, and in order to compensate for this change, the DfE applied a national weighting of 48.02% to the 2016 summer secondary prior attainment data, and a weighting of 58.05% for summer 2017 secondary prior attainment so that any financial turbulence caused by the change in performance data was minimised.

The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP) changed in 2013, so a weighting may be used to ensure that funding delivered through the primary prior attainment factor is not disproportionately affected by the year groups (years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5) assessed under the new framework.

Mobility factor funding received was £193k based on last year's APT, however the number of mobile pupils (those not starting in September or January for reception children) has fallen, therefore overall funding via this factor reduced to £154k.

## Modelling

Due to an increase in pupil numbers, a different distribution of pupils between the primary and secondary phase, and the updated data set received from DfE, when the mainstream school budgets were calculated using the consulted and forum agreed factor values, minimum funding guarantee (MFG) and capping values, there was £260k surplus funding that had not been allocated via the formula. Therefore additional adjustments were made to the above criteria to ensure the surplus is allocated to school budgets and maximise the available funding.

The first adjustment in allocating the surplus of funding was to remove the funding cap. This resulted in an additional allocation to schools of £175k, which left £85k to be allocated.

The next adjustment made was to move fully to the National Funding Formula (NFF) rates for English as an Additional Language (EAL) for both primary and secondary pupils, and Income Deprivation Affecting Children Indices (IDACI) for primary band D

and secondary band B. This adjustment allocated an additional £59k of the surplus to schools.

Following these adjustments, there was still just under £26k of surplus funding to allocate, therefore a final adjustment was made to increase key stage 3 (KS3) Age Weighted Pupil Unit (AWPU) by £4.88, as there was not enough funding to move fully to any other NFF rates. This allocated the majority of the remaining surplus, leaving unallocated funding of £28.23.

For the model, all validation flags within the APT are green, which means that all validation checks within the APT have been satisfied, indicating that the model complies with Schools and Early Years Finance Regulations 2017, and the required percentage allocations for Age Weighted Pupil Unit (AWPU) and pupil led factors have been satisfied.

A copy of the proposed proforma is shown in appendix 1, with a funding comparison between 2017/18 and the proposed funding for 2018/19 in appendix 2 together with changes in pupil numbers.

# **Proposal**

That Schools Forum approves the allocation of additional resources through removal of the funding cap, to move to the NFF rates for EAL, primary IDACI D and secondary IDACI B, and to increase KS3 AWPU by £4.88 form the previously agreed level. That Schools Forum approves the values for the formula factors in the proforma in appendix 1, and notes the 2017/18 and proposed 2018/19 comparisons for post MFG budgets, and the pupil movements.

#### Recommendations

That Schools Forum approves:-

- The removal of the funding cap from schools gaining under the proposed formula
- Additional funding for EAL to move to the NFF value
- Additional funding for IDACI primary band D and Secondary band B to move further towards the NFF value
- A small amount of additional funding for KS3 AWPU
- The proposed APT as detailed in appendix 1

For the following reasons:-

- To enable Gateshead mainstream schools funding to be calculated
- To enable the proforma to be submitted to the DfE within timescale
- To move Gateshead's mainstream schools funding formula towards the NFF.
