### Please give a general description of the premises (please read guidance note 1)

This is an existing premises but is subject to redevelopment. It formerly operated as a Frankie & Benny's Restaurant and has an existing Premises Licence (Licence Number 00CH 01018). This application is a new Premises Licence application in respect of our clients proposed development of part of the site as a Taco Bell. The proposal is to develop the site as a Taco Bell restaurant as shown on the plans deposited with the application.

The Licence is sought to allow the sale of alcohol for consumption on or off the premises with food or for consumption off the premises ancillary to a takeaway meal ordered from the premises.

The proposed permitted hours for licensable activities for these premises should be

- 1. For the sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises 10:00 to 04.00 seven days a week.
- 2. Late night refreshment from 23:00 to 04:00 hours seven days a week.
- 3. Films to be authorised for use on an occasional basis.
- 4. Opening hours for the premises will be 09:00 to 04:30 seven days a week.

There will be a drive thru facility as part of the proposal but it is not requested that there be authorisation for the sale of alcohol through the drive thru facility. It is however requested that there be a late night refreshment (food and drink) and non alcoholic drinks (through the drive thru facility shown on the plan.

The appropriate drawings deposited with this application are as follows:-

Please note that the internal public areas shown on the drawings are intended to be used (as required) for all licensable activities.

Please note that the sale of alcohol will be very much ancillary to the principal activity of the premises as being a fast food Mexican restaurant/takeaway.

Stringent management controls in terms of staff training and re-training, the operation of Challenge 21, the maintenance of an incident and refusals record will seek to ensure that the premises will operate with a high standard of management and will not create a public nuisance or result in additional crime, disorder or antisocial behaviour in the area or otherwise undermine the licensing objectives.

The applicant already operates similar premises within Sheffield, Barnsley, Nottingham and Leeds.

These premises do not fall within a Cumulative Impact Policy area.

It is not anticipated the application will adversely impact upon the licensing objectives.

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. The use of door staff will be risk assessed on an ongoing basis by the licence holder of premises supervisor. Where engaged, door staff shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- Staff will receive training on matters concerning underage sales, drugs policies and operating procedures.
- There shall be a zero tolerance policy in relation to drugs at the premises and there shall be regular checks by management to prevent the use of drugs by patrons. Drugs seized shall be stored securely and handed to the police.
- 4. The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme and will require photographic identification from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years (Challenge 21)
- 5. The management of the premises will liaise with police on issues of local concern or disorder.
- 6. CCTV will be installed with recording facilities, such recordings shall be retained for a period of 31 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the Police.
- 7. There shall be no drinks promotions at the premises which are inconsistent with the need to promote responsible drinking.

#### c) Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
- 2. The premises will have adequate safety and fire fighting equipment and such equipment will be maintained in good operational order.
- Staff will be trained on matters of safety, evacuation and use of emergency equipment as required.

- Spillages and breakages will be removed as soon as possible to reduce the risk to patrons and staff,
   Toughened glasses will be used in the premises where appropriate.
   Fire Exits and means of escape shall be kept clear and in good operational condition.
- d) The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 2. Patrons will be encouraged by staff to leave quietly and respect the interests of the occupiers of any nearby noise sensitive premises, Where appropriate the licensee or a suitable staff member will monitor patrons leaving at the closing time.
- Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 4. Contact numbers for local taxi firm(s) shall be kept at the premises and made available to patrons requiring a taxi.

e) The protection of children from harm

- 1. The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risks of harm to children have been identified.
- 2. No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.
- 3. There shall be adequate controls in place including staff training to safeguard against the sale of alcohol to persons under 18 years.
- 4. The premises supervisor or appointed staff member shall ensure that when children are admitted to the premises their presence is not inconsistent with the style of operation of the premises at that time and the licensable activities that are being carried out.
- 5. Policies in relation to children shall be adequately communicated to patrons by staff or through appropriate signage.
