Northumbria Police are concerned that the licensing objectives and in particular The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children From Harm will be undermined should a premises licence be granted.

### Please provide as much information as possible to support the representation (Please read guidance note 2)

Northumbria Police feel that the grant of the premises licence and the authorisation to permit the sale of alcohol would have detrimental effect on the quality of people living and working in this area.

These premises previously held a premises licence. On 7<sup>th</sup> September 2011 the Licensing Sub-committee held a licensing review hearing and subsequently made the decision to revoke the premises licence. At the time, Sub-committee considered concerns of anti-social behaviour, alcohol related incidents and underage sales.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2017 Northumbria Police and the Local Authority secured an anti-social behaviour injunction made against Callum Barnes involved in number of incidents at Trafford.

Inspector 7293 Robson will say that "the problems of anti-social behaviour in the area continue" despite joint Police and the Local Authority's efforts.

Inspector 7293 Robson will also say that "consumption of alcohol by young people and the resulting crime and disorder is a significant community problem that impacts on crime, within many areas of the Borough as well as being an issue that puts children and young people at risk themselves".

Northumbria Police wish to object to the application. It is believed, that should the premises licence be granted, the licensing objectives under the licensing Act 2003 and in particular the prevention of crime & disorder and protection of children from harm will be undermined.

The review was instigated by The Local Authority after staff member sold alcohol to a 16 year old volunteer on 4<sup>th</sup> February 2011.

Police statement reported an increase in anti-social behaviour since a recent grant of the premises licence on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2010;

### **Enough is enough**

Safer Gateshead Partnership includes a number of agencies including Gateshead Council, Northumbria Police and The Gateshead Housing Company who are all working together to make Gateshead a safer place to live, work and visit.

We need your help to combat antisocial behaviour in your area and have produced this leaflet drawing your attention to a particular individual who is the subject of an injunction.

### What are anti-social behaviour injunctions?

Anti-Social Behaviour Injunctions are civil orders obtained from the County Court. Injunctions can be used to prevent a range of anti-social behaviour relating to housing and the wider neighbourhood, for example, using a property for drug dealing, playing loud music, barking dogs, verbal abuse and vandalism. An Injunction gives details of the behaviour that the offender is prohibited from.

## How long do they last?

The court may grant an injunction for a specified period as it sees fit. Or the court may decide that the injunction will apply until it is: varied (the terms have changed or the injunction is extended) or discharged (it comes to an end). This can mean that an injunction can be in force for the lifetime of the person who it is obtained against.

## How can local people help?

Local people are encouraged to report incidents and collect evidence in order to secure any injunctions. They can also help to monitor any breach of injunction.

# What happens if the offender breaches the conditions of an injunction?

The breach of an injunction is a criminal offence and the offender can be arrested and could face a prison sentence of up to two years, an unlimited fine for contempt of court or both.



I am the Neighbourhood Police Inspector for Central Gateshead. Within my role, I am responsible for crime and disorder issues within Gateshead, including the Allerdene area. I also have policing responsibility for licensing matters.

The Allerdene area of Gateshead has suffered in recent years from disorder associated with young people and alcohol. In particular, the area around Harlow Green has seen significant increases of alcohol related anti social behaviour over the past few years. The shopping area on Trafford has been at the centre of this behaviour and is often a meeting point for local youths. Allerdene News is situated in this shopping area and has in the past had a licence to sell alcohol. This licence was revoked in 2011.

In more recent times, a number of actions were carried out by the Police in conjunction with Officers from Gateshead Council. This was as a direct result of complaints from shop owners in Trafford. Large groups of youths were targeting the shops and the public who access these facilities. When investigated, it was clear that most incidents were going unreported with shopkeepers putting up with it. An investigation managed to identify one of the youths who subsequently received an Anti social Behaviour Injunction – granted in December 2017. What was apparent is that the age group of the youths ranged from 12year old to 19 year old. This increased the risk of proxy sales of alcohol for any off licence targeted by the groups of youths.

The problems of anti social behaviour in the area continues despite some success for Police and Gateshead Council. Since the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2018, Northumbria Police have recorded 12 incidents of anti social behaviour within 500 metres of Allerdene News.

Policing operations continue to take place to attempt to combat this trend, focusing resources from the police and local authority into the area to engage with youths. Despite this investment, little progress has been made with continued issues concerning youth related disorder within the area.

This issue constantly crops up at meetings with local businesses, residents and local councillors.




Consumption of alcohol by young people and the resulting crime and disorder is a significant community problem that impacts on crime, and the fear of crime, within many areas of the Borough as well as being an issue that puts children and young people at risk themselves.

Within the Harlow Green area, several members of the public have spoken to me and my staff regarding large groups gathering in the area, causing damage, using foul and abusive language, noise and litter problems.

Consumption of alcohol by children and the resulting crime and disorder is a significant community problem that impacts on crime, and the fear of crime, within many areas of the Borough as well as being an issue that puts children and young people at risk themselves. Significant public nuisance is also caused when groups of youths congregate in the local area in the ready expectation of obtaining alcohol.

Northumbria Police object to the application as the granting of a Licence to sell alcohol would undermine the quality of life for nearby residents and further increase the levels of crime and anti social behaviour in the area.

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





### The Sub Committee has decided as follows -

That in the circumstances, on this occasion, no other action was likely to be effective in ensuring the promotion of the licensing objectives and it was necessary to revoke the premises licence and this was proportionate to the concerns that the Sub Committee found.

### Reasons

### Written documentation

In advance of the hearing the Sub Committee read the reports of the Licensing Officer dated 31 August 2011 which set out –

- the background to the applications
- details of the application and representations made
- the parties to the hearing, and
- the matters for their decision.

Because there were simultaneous applications before the sub committee to review the Premises Licence and to vary it a discussion was held with all parties and Mr Awan agreed that evidence from both applications be heard together.

#### The report contained -

- a copy of the review application by the Weights & Measures Authority containing details of underage sale on 4 February 2011 where a 16 year old volunteer was sold a bottle of blue WKD alcohol by the Licence Holder's 15 year old son and the conviction of the Licence holder for this offence under 146(1) of the Licensing Act;
- witness statements from PC Terry McGow dated 21.02.11 concerning one incident of underage sale he prevented; various incidents of breach of conditions on the Licence;
- further witness statement of Terry McGow dated 4.08.11 concerning two further underage sales viewed from premises CCTV recordings;
- witness statement of Darren Adams concerning analysis of anti social behaviour and alcohol related incidents around the premises;
- Representations from the Local Safeguarding Children Board dated 09.08.11 and 22.07.11;
- Information from two local residents;
- Representations from 12 local residents (variation only);
- a copy of the premises licence;
- a copy of the advertisement of the review application and variation application;

- relevant extracts from the Pool of Model Conditions from Gateshead Council's Licensing Policy;
- relevant extracts from Gateshead Council's Licensing Policy;
- relevant extracts from the National Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003; and
- an area plan

The Sub Committee found that they had serious concerns about the promotion of the licensing objectives of —

- The prevention of crime and disorder; and
- The protection of children from harm.

These concerns were based on the information the Sub Committee read and heard regarding –

- The pattern of underage sales at the premises
- The fact that the Premises Licence had been issued in October 2010 and persistent problems had arisen almost immediately
- The fact that the underage sale on 4 February 2011 had been committed by a child without any training in the sale of alcohol
- The breaches of the licence conditions numbers 3,4,7,8,9 and 10
- Problems with the management of the premises (in particular the increase in incidents of anti social behaviour in the area).
- Breach of condition 5 of the Licence in that the Refusals Register could not be produced at the premises
- The Designated Premises Supervisor worked at another Premises and viewed activities at Allerdene News via the CCTV

Mr Awan accepted the evidence of the offences and as given and did not challenge representations regarding further underage sales or anti social behaviour.

#### He stated:

- Since taking up the Licence there had been a change of staff and the new staff did not know the customers
- The incidents of underage age sales of alcohol seen by the police officer from CCTV arose because those youths had previously shown the sales assistant fake ID

- Since the underage sale in February he had organised professional training for all his staff
- He had CCTV and a refusals book and had co-operated with Police

Mr Awan accepted the evidence of the offences and as given and did not challenge representations regarding further underage sales or anti social behaviour. His points with regard to the application to review were equally relevant in support of his application to vary the hours on the Licence. He stated that he only made the application to extend the hours in response to customer demand. He stated that he had a Petition signed by customers, started on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2011.

Mr Howey and Sgt Adams also asked the Sub Committee to consider points oral submissions made in the application to vary. Both were concerned about the ability of the management of the premises to promote the Licensing objectives and submitted that Conditions on the Licence had not been effective in preventing crime and disorder or protecting children from harm.

Mr Pigg stated his concerns about underage sales and anti social behaviour and stated that incidents of both were frequent and still occurring. He stated that he knew the youths leaving the shop with alcohol or drinking it outside had got it from the premises because he had seen them coming out with blue carrier bags. He knew the ages of the children concerned because they lived on the estate and he had known them and their families for many years.

The Sub Committee found that they had serious concerns about the promotion of the licensing objectives of –

- The prevention of crime and disorder; and
- The protection of children from harm.

These concerns were based on the information the Sub Committee read and heard regarding –

- The pattern of underage sales at the premises;
- The fact that the Premises Licence had been issued in October 2010 and persistent problems had arisen almost immediately;
- The fact that the underage sale on 4 February 2011 had been committed by a child without any training in the sale of alcohol;
- The breaches of the licence conditions numbers 3,4,7,8,9 and 10;

- Problems with the management of the premises (in particular the increase in incidents of anti social behaviour in the area);
- Breach of condition 5 of the Licence in that the Refusals Register could not be produced at the premises;
- The Designated Premises Supervisor worked at another Premises and viewed activities at Allerdene News via the CCTV;
- Local residents reported numerous incidents of anti social behaviour credibly linked to these premises and to underage consumption of alcohol;
- The conditions imposed on the Licence were those already appropriate and had failed to have any impact on the problems found;
- The existence of CCTV and a Refusals book and training had not prevented the problems or acted as a deterrent to the staff;
- The sub committee did not believe the Premises Licence Holder was able to manage the business so as to promote the Licensing objectives; and
- The Sub committee had heard no evidence to suggest that removing the Designated Premises Supervisor would have any effect in promoting the Licensing objectives or improving the management of the Premises.

The Sub Committee was aware that rather than revoke the Premises Licence

Do nothing;

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- Add conditions to the licence;
- Modify the existing conditions to the licence;
- Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- Suspend the licence for a period of up to three months; and
- Remove a licensable activity from the scope of the licence (which in this case would have the effect of revoking the licence as there is only one licensable activity authorised by the licence).


However the Sub Committee, having considered these options, and having been guided by the National Guidance, considered revocation of the Premises Licence to be appropriate in this instance.

Having made this decision the Sub Committee did not consider the application to vary the hours of the Premises Licence.

In reaching this decision the Sub Committee has been persuaded by the individual circumstances of this Application and does not intend to create a general exception to its Policy or to create a precedent.

### Please state the ground(s) for representation (please read guidance note 1)

The Licensing Authority (in its capacity as a Responsible Authority) have a number of concerns regarding this application to grant a new Licence to allow the sale of alcohol (off the premises).

There is also a concern that the already high levels of crime and anti-social behaviour may be worsened by the addition of alcohol sales in this location and it has not been adequately demonstrated that management arrangements could overcome this concerns or others.

In particular this location has been a magnet for anti-social behaviour and crime. The Licensing Authority in conjunction with the Community Safety Parntership 'Safer Gateshead' in accordance with Section 2.1 of the Section 182 Guidance, has sort advice on Crime and Disorder (anti-social behaviour) in this location. It highlights this parade of shops as a hotspot for both within the Chowdene Ward. The maps area attached as an appendix to this representation.

With regard to the hours proposed the application seeks sales from 06:30, the Council's statement of Licensing Policy specifically states AT SECTION 9.1 that:

It is expected that premises whose primary activity is off licence sales will not normally be open between 23:00 and 07:00 hours. Applicants wishing to operate beyond 23:00 hours will need to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority, in their operating schedule, that there will be no significant disturbance to members of the public living, working or otherwise engaged in normal activity around the premises concerned. Opening hours beyond 23:00 hours will generally be considered to be more acceptable for premises in commercial or tourist areas with high levels of public transport availability, rather than premises in predominately residential areas.




