- 3. The Department for Education has drafted a further statement for child and family social workers involved in permanence planning for children who are looked after or on the edge of care.
- 4. The consultation seeks the views on the content of the proposed knowledge and skills statement, which aims to promote depth of practice in planning and achieving permanence.
