Gateshead Safeguarding Children Partnership (GSCP) is the body responsible for the protection of children from harm. The GSCP is concerned that the licensable activities taking place at Sheriffs Highway Stores Ltd are not in accordance with the promotion of another licensing objective, which is the protection of children from harm.

It has come to the attention of the GSCP that on 24th February 2022, a test purchase exercise using a 15 year old child volunteer was carried out at the premises Sheriffs Highway Stores Ltd, 168 – 170 Sheriff Highway, Gateshead NE9 5SD, and the child was sold a bottle of Desperados Beer. This is an alcoholic beverage containing 5.9% alcohol. I believe that this act undermines the licensing objective of the protection of children from harm and contributes to the antisocial behaviour caused by youths consuming alcohol in the area.

Safeguarding Partnerships are the key statutory mechanism for protecting children from harm and agreeing how the relevant organisations in each local area will cooperate to safeguard and promote the welfare of children, and for ensuring the effectiveness of what they do.

Access to alcohol by young people and the resulting crime and disorder is a significant community problem that impacts on crime, and the fear of crime, within many areas of the Borough as well as being an issue that puts children and young people at risk themselves.

The vision of safeguarding partnership is that every child should grow up in a loving and secure environment, which is free from abuse, neglect and crime, enabling them to enjoy good health and fulfil their social and educational potential. Evidence suggests that binge drinking in adolescence could limit opportunities for this to occur and therefore the safeguarding partnership is keen to ensure that licensees restrict access to alcohol by underage drinkers and have processes in place to ensure the protection of children from harm.

Research suggests that the adolescent brain may be uniquely sensitive to alcohol's effects due to the major changes in brain structure and function that occur during this developmental period. Studies have found that binge drinking by youths is also associated with alcohol-related violence and other anti-social behaviours.

A UK study found that binge drinking in adolescence was associated with an increased risk of health, social, educational and economic adversity continuing into later adult life. Alcohol intoxication can occur during binge drinking and the acute toxic effects are generally related to blood alcohol concentrations. There is evidence to suggest that the severe hypoglycaemia (low blood sugar) that can accompany alcohol intoxication and may result in coma occurs more commonly in adolescents than adults.

Deaths from alcohol poisoning appear to occur most often when relatively inexperienced drinkers consume very large amounts of alcohol in a short time.

Re SHERIFFS HIGHWAY STORE:

The test purchase exercise was carried out following complaints received to the trading standards service from local police and councillors of youths drinking alcohol and causing ASB in the area.

The shop was visited on 27th May 2021 and on 2nd December 2021 to provide advice in relation to underage sales and provide the business with tools to prevent sales to underage persons. An advice information pack was left with Jaafar JAAFAR on 27th May 2021 who confirmed he was the business owner at that time. The licence holder was confirmed as Farhad JAMNEJAD.

The test purchase exercise was carried out on 24th February 2022 and the young person was sold alcohol without being required to produce ID. It was confirmed that both parties own the business that operates from the premises with Mr JAMNEJAD being sole director but Mr JAAFAR being a person with significant control so the directing mind of the business.

The sale was carried out by an employee who had been working with the business only a short matter of time and hadn't been given any training by either of the business owners. Also, no training records could be produced by either of the business operators.

The seller could not find the refusals book when asked for this on the date of the sale. They do operate a challenge 25 policy, but this was not followed on the date of the sale. They confirmed that DPS Amer Idris PAUL is no longer working for them and had left the company a few months before. They had failed to notify the licensing section with regards to the change and didn't realise they had to.

Intelligence to trading standards in relation to possible sales of illegal tobacco from the premises had also been reported that were taking place at the van owned by Mr JAAFAR outside of the premises. When trading standards had visited the premises in order to view the CCTV of this alleged act, it was found that the CCTV system had stopped working one hour before the time we had requested to view it. An inspection of the vehicle at that time was carried out and 6 packets of illegal tobacco were found in a carrier bag.

Trading standards do not believe that this premises is operating well and that the licensing
objectives are being undermined. The GSCP feel they are putting children at risk of harm and are
contributing to antisocial behaviour in the area.
