
FIGHTING CRIME

<u>Total Recorded Crime (Panel KPI)</u>

Performance Headlines

Total crime has increased by 5% for the 12 months to January 2024, with an increase in violence against the person, theft and handling (particularly shoplifting and theft from the person), burglary, robbery, sexual offences and hate crime compared to 12 months to January 2023.

When compared to pre-Covid crime levels in December 2019, total crime is down 1.8%.

Anti-social behaviour incidents

Performance Headlines

Looking at February 2024 compared to February 2023. There has been a 17.8% reduction in ASB incidents . 2,631 incidents in Feb 2024 vs 3,202 in Feb 2023.

Motorbike disorder and ASB on the transport network continue to be key areas of focus. The Force have launched Operation Capio to target motorbike and electric bike enabled crime and ASB. Partnership operations (Op Impact and Neighbourhood Week of Action) have recently been utilised to tackle the issue with a view to reducing incidents and increasing public confidence. A new motorbike ASB dedicated task force has been implemented within Southern Area Command which is a hotspot location. The Force has also invested in drone and stinger capability which will increase proactive options to tackle offences.

Anti-social behaviour satisfaction

Performance Headlines


Significantly less ASB victims were satisfied with the actions taken compared to the same period last year. Dissatisfied victims mainly perceived that police had taken a lack of robust action in response to their report and/or had failed to take it seriously. Not providing resolution to the ASB issue, taking a long time to act and/or police not following up on the actions they said they would take, were also drivers of dissatisfaction.

Repeat Victims - Domestic Abuse




Repeat Victims - Sexual offences



Police Response Times - Grade 1 Urban

Performance Headlines


Grade 1 incident demand remains higher than previous years. However, for the 12 months to January 2024, there have been 2% less grade 1 incidents than the previous 12-month period. Grade 1 demand for 2023 is 51% higher than it was for 2019 and has increased year on year from 2019-2022.



Police Response Times - Grade 1 Rural

Performance Headlines

The percentage of grade 1 (urban) incidents attended within 15 minutes was 79% for the 12 months to January 2024, a 1% increase when compared to the 12 months to January 2023. The percentage of grade 1 (rural) incidents attended within 20 minutes was 58%, a reduction of 1%pt compared to the 12 months to January 2023.




<u>Answer Times - 999 Emergency Calls</u>

Performance Headlines

There has also been a significant improvement in the 90th percentile compared to the previous 12-month period, with 90% of 999 calls answered in 6 seconds compared to 58 seconds for the 12 months to January 2023.

For the 12 months to January 2024, the number of 999 calls increased by 2% compared to the previous 12 months, from 300,596 to 306,100.

999 call volumes in 2023 were 24% higher than they were in 2019 and have increased each year since then, although the rate of increase has slowed down over the last four years.



Answer Times - 101 Non-Emergency Calls

Performance Headlines

For the 12 months to January 2024, the number of 101 non-emergency calls increased by 8% compared to the previous 12 months, from 238,167 to 257,869.

The percentage of 101 calls answered within 1 minute for the 12 months to January 2024 is 64%; this compares to 43% for the 12 months to January 2023. The average answer time for 101 non-emergency calls for the 12 months to January 2024 was 1 minute and 28 seconds, compared to 4 minutes and 17 seconds for the 12 months to January 2023.

Serious violence offences have remained relatively consistent over the winter months. The force is placed 37th nationally for the 12 months to December 2023. Knife enabled serious violence accounted for 5% of the total serious violence offences in the 12 months to December 2023, which is an increase of 0.5% pts compared to the previous period.

To support a focused approach to tackling and reducing serious violence, the force launched a new Prevention Department in October 2023. The Prevention Department has assumed tactical and strategic ownership of the delivery of the serious youth violence portfolio, including public spaces, knife crime and corrosive substances.
